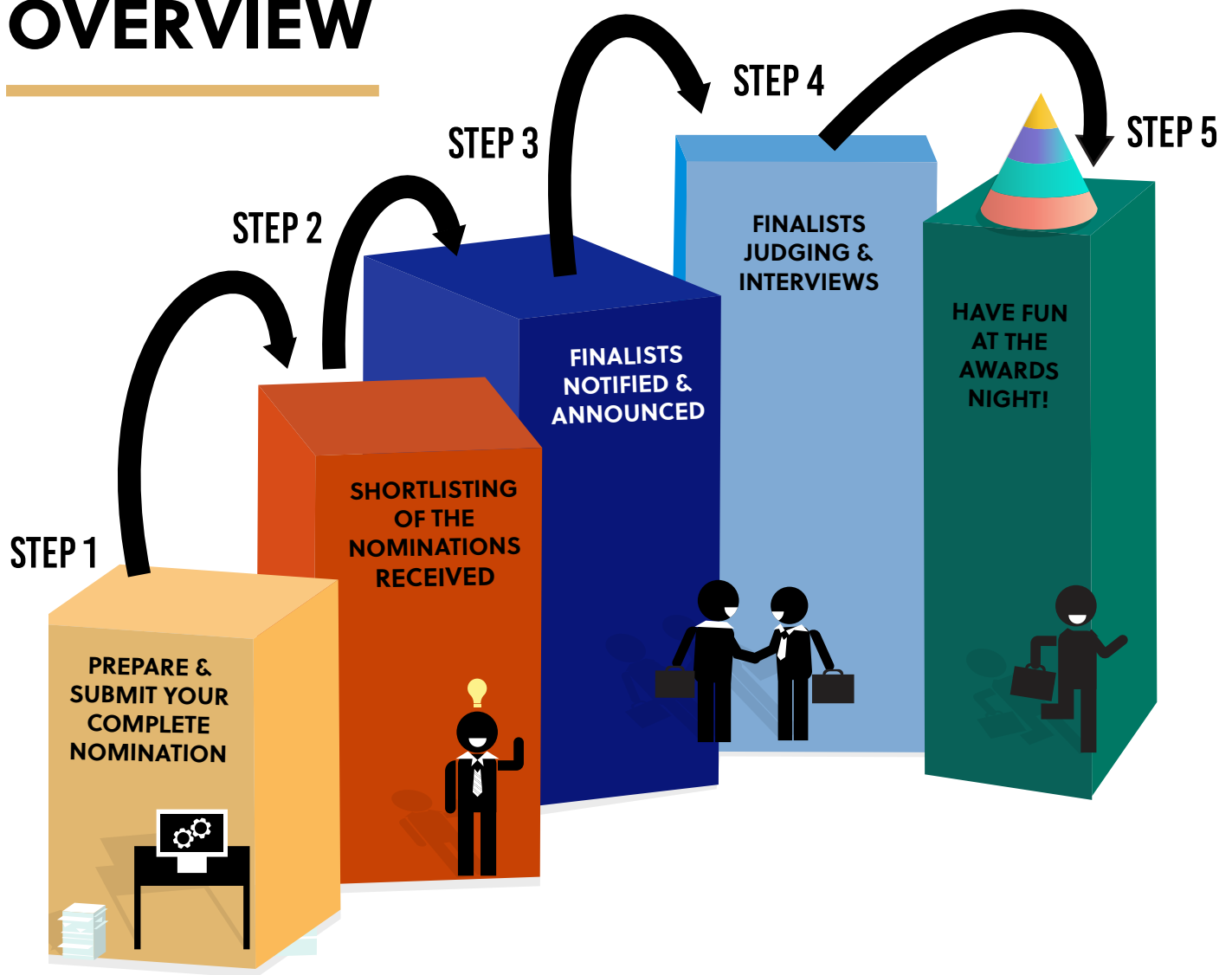

3. The nomination in its entirety has been completed by you.
4. The nomination is endorsed by your employer (if applicable).
5. The nomination is endorsed by your Registered Training Organisation (if applicable).
6. Be prepared to sign a talent release.
7. You have photos and digital copies of certificates, awards etc. ready to attach to your nomination.
8. You and your employer acknowledge if shortlisted you must be available to attend the judging process.
9. **You and your employer acknowledge should you be a finalist, you must be available to attend the GTNT Group Awards Ceremony on Friday, 3 JULY 2026.** Not attending = forfeiting finalist position.
10. **Must be able to have FUN! NON-NEGOTIABLE!**

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All nominees will need to read and agree to the Conditions of Entry prior to submitting their nomination.
2. The closing time and date for all nominations is 10pm, 28 February 2026. No nomination will be accepted after this date.
3. **Nominees for individual categories must be employed or managed by GTNT Group's GTO.**
4. All nominees must complete a nomination form and answer all questions. You may ask your Employment Specialist for assistance in completing your nomination.
5. Nominees must meet all other eligibility criteria.
6. Nominees must agree to abide by the decision of the judging panel, which is final and cannot be appealed.
7. Finalists must agree for their photographs, profiles and training details to be used for promotional purposes by GTNT Group and their host business.
8. Finalists must be prepared to be involved in promotional events and activities if required.
9. Finalists must be available for the judging interview, filming and attendance of the GTNT Group Awards Night. (Filming content is used to create a short video for the night)
10. Winners of individual categories must be prepared to present a short speech upon receiving their award.

**!! Winners and Runner Up's of selected categories will be nominated for their respective eligible categories at the NT Training Awards. GTNT Group will contact you to discuss your nomination in the lead up to the NT Training Awards Ceremony.**

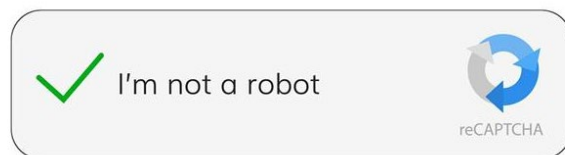

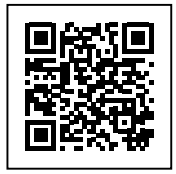
